

DDI Developers Group Report 2012/13

The DDI Developers community is a group of developers implementing software applications on the basis of the DDI specification. Currently, most of them focus on DDI Lifecycle, but software development on the basis of DDI Codebook is still going on as well. Developers are coming from archives, research institutions, and commercial companies. The DDI Developers community is not a DDI Alliance working group. The common understanding is that the development of software on the basis of a specification like DDI is a different operation than the development of the specification itself.

The community has had three meetings during the past year. In total 51 developers from 22 different organizations have participated in these meetings.

The community had a one-day meeting before the 38th IASSIST conference in Washington, DC, USA, on June 5, 2012. 24 persons from 15 different organizations participated.
